(ACT NO. 38 OF 2001) OF AMENDMENTS IN IDENTIFICATION OF PERSONS AND ENTITIES BY THE

In terms of section 26A(3)(a) of the Financial Intelligence Centre Act, 2001 (Act No. 38 of 2001), I, Xolisile J Khanyile, Director of the Financial Intelligence Centre, hereby give notice that on **19/08/2020** the Security Council of the United Nations, pursuant to United Nations Security Council Resolution **UNSCR 2127 (5 December 2013)**, amended the particulars by which it had identified **BOSCO, TAGANDA, Bosco Ntaganda Ntagenda, General Taganda, CDi.030** contemplated in Notice No **TFS-01-01/04/2019** of **01/04/2019** issued under section 26A(3) of the FIC Act, as follows -


